

YORK COUNTY FAIR ENTRY PROCEDURES FOR HORSE ENTRIES

Rules & Regulations

No 4-H horse can be shown unless identification papers are recorded at the County Extension Office prior to June 15.

Family members can show the same horse only if they are in different age divisions **except** in halter and showmanship where a horse can only be shown once.

Members may not show more than two halter horses. We must have the name of the horse(s) that you will be entering in halter classes on the entry form.

Fillies and colts (class J301009) will not return for champion mare or champion gelding.

The walk-trot class is for junior riders who are not comfortable riding at a lope. Riders entering this class may not enter pleasure, horsemanship or equitation classes. The walk-trot class will be judged as a horsemanship class.

Intermediate and senior riders in the horsemanship class may be asked to ride an individual pattern.

Horses entered in the 2 & 3 Year Old Snaffle Bit Pleasure class are not eligible to be ridden in any other pleasure class.

Regulations, including requirements for 4-H horse show participation, tack and attire, procedures and score sheets will be those set forth in "4-H Horse Show and Judging Guide" (4H 373 revised 2006), which is available from the County Extension Office.

Any horse not controlled at all times by his rider or handler may be dismissed or not allowed to enter his or her class at the discretion of the superintendents. Any decisions on eligibility will be made by the superintendent.

Participants in the Pre 4-H aged classes should be registered with the extension office to determine an exhibitor number and to be eligible to receive premium monies. Riders in the 4-H classes are not eligible for the Open Class Pre-4-H Aged classes and riders in the Open Class Pre 4-H Aged classes are not eligible for 4-H competition.

Completing Horse Entry Form:

To complete the horse entry form you will need a copy of the York County Fair Book. If you do not have a copy, stop by the extension office or various banks and businesses throughout the county.

When filling out the entry form, you will need to refer the 4-H horse section of the fair book for the rules and regulations and class numbers for the various county fair classes. You will need to refer to Open Class section for the rules, regulations and class numbers for the Open Class Pre 4-H Aged classes.

If you have any questions or concerns while filling out the entry form, please stop by or call the extension office (362-5508) for assistance.

Make sure the entry form is filled out completely with all information requested. Make sure the form is signed by you, the exhibitor, and a parent or guardian and most importantly, make sure the form is turned into the York County Extension Office no later than **JULY 15!!**
